COURSE DESCRIPTION AND GOALS:

Bahasa Indonesia/Malaysia 10 (BIM 10) is an intergrated course in learning Indonesian and Malay languages. However, this course will concentrate more on the use of Indonesian language and relate it afterwards to Malay as these two languages have a high degree of similarity.

This course is composed of eight (8) lessons which will cover different skills in learning Bahasa Indonesia through reading, writing, speaking. Each lesson includes exercises on reading, grammar, vocabulary, writing, and conversation. Lectures and activities for each lesson will need 3-4 days to cover.

The course aims to equip the student with the basics of Indonesian language so as to be able to practise it in speaking and writing.
