## Guidelines for the Final Projects:

### Hapon 100

- 1. Group of 4-5 members only.
- 2. Each group will make an original 10–15 min skit in Japanese to be presented in class.
- 3. The final script should be submitted a week before the designated date of presentation.

# Hapon 101

- 1. Group of 2–3 members only. Each group will be assigned to a particular destination in Philippines.
- 2. Each group must research about their assigned place including the following: famous food or product, activities available in the area, fares, accommodations, and flight details.
- 3. Make a <u>3-4minute promotional video</u> of your assigned location. All information or dialogues that will be flashed should all be in Nihongo.
- 4. A brochure-type written report in Japanese should also be submitted. Final date of submission will be decided in class.
